Charting the LifeCourse

The LifeCourse Framework

The LifeCourse Framework allows individuals with intellectual disabilities and families the opportunity to focus on a specific life stage and experience natural and positive opportunities while still having supports

The focus of traditional services and supports encourage health and safety of the individual as well as address the wants and needs they desire in an everyday life. However, the Life Course methodology, individuals and families begin at their current life stage and plan for the present and future. Individuals can build on their self-determination and community inclusion.

The LifeCourse refers to three “buckets” that connect each part of a person’s life such as jobs, family, friends, and housing situations. The 1st bucket is obtaining the information you need to go through life by learning about community resources. The 2nd bucket is learning to connect with others and those community resources. The third bucket is having tangible goods and utilizing services that all folks use.

Marielle presented on the different types of Guardianship including Plenary v. Limited, Guardianship of the Estate, and Guardianship of the Person. She elaborated on the roles, documentation requirements, and expectations of a Legal Guardian.
